Camera Mouse is a free program that allows you to control the mouse pointer on a Windows computer just by moving your head.

The program was developed to help people with disabilities use the computer. The main audience for this program is people who do not have reliable control of a hand but who can move their head. People with Cerebral Palsy, Spinal Muscular Atrophy, ALS, Stroke, TBI, Multiple Sclerosis, various neurological disorders use this program to run all types of computer software, including education programs, communication programs and web browsers.

**All that is needed to use Camera Mouse is a Windows computer and a webcam.** Camera Mouse is available for free download.

### Who can benefit from Camera Mouse?

Camera Mouse is intended for people with physical disabilities, people who cannot move their hands to control a mouse or speak to a voice recognition program. To use Camera Mouse a person needs to be able to control the movement of his head.
